Since July 2012 our instructors have been teaching CPR and first aid classes to scout groups in the Central Florida area. All students must be registered with the Boy Scouts of America or be a family member. Members of the Girl Scouts of American and American Heritage Girls and their families are also welcome. Other groups must be approved by the BSA Troop 62 Committee.

In addition, we can provide training in all these areas at the instructor level. As the Education Center grows we will need qualified instructors. All of our instructors are volunteers who have completed BSA Youth Protection Training.

Whenever possible we will encourage students to register for the on-line classes. These high quality classes provide excellent instruction and once completed, our instructors provide a skills check and issue a certification card. Most certifications are valid for two years. The advantage of the on-line format is all the work is done by the student at their own pace and the skills check takes about 30 minutes depending on the course.
